In any Class with Lot, "Any other variety," more than one entry may be made in that Lot provided each variety is named. If three or more entries by different exhibitors are made and named in this Lot, a new Lot will be added so that exhibits may be judged in their own category. Be sure that the "variety" is written on the exhibitor's tags and make entry sheet and tags correspond to Lot and Class. (Five (5) each of ears, stalks or heads. One (1) pint each of seeds or grains. Sheaves should not be less than two inches, nor more than five inches in diameter. Heads must have stems not more nor less than four inches and are not to be tied.) Vegetable entries must contain the amount; number of fruits or number of commercial bunches specified in an entry Lot.

One individual may make no more than one entry in any Lot. Items of a closely similar form will be considered to be the same Lot. One person may enter only one of the items. Bunches must be banded together. An incorrect number of items will disqualify the entry. In any Lot listed as "Any other variety," more than one entry may be made in that Lot, provided each variety is different and named. An exhibitor must place the letters A, B, C, D, etc. after a Lot Number, for each entry under "Any other variety." If three or more entries are made and named in a Lot by different exhibitors, a new Lot will be added so that exhibits may be judged in their own category. Be sure that the "variety" is written on the exhibitor's tag. When you enter heavy squash, pumpkins and watermelons under Class 19 and the appropriate Lot Number, the heaviest is automatically selected for the Special Awards and no extra entry is necessary. If you know the weight, make a note on the entry tag. The decision of the judge is final in all cases. First place \$3.00 Second place \$2.00.

GENERAL FLORICULTURE DEPARTMENT RULES.

1. Competition is open to all amateur growers and arrangers.
2. Entry tags will be provided and must accompany each and every entry.
3. **All entries are to be clean and insect free . Entry Chairmen have the right to disqualify any exhibit, which does not conform to this schedule.**
4. **Exhibitors are allowed unlimited entries in each lot if each is a separate named variety, type, or color. Lots will be divided as entries warrant. All will be judged variety against variety.**
5. **All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor within COCHISE COUNTY,** except in native dry arrangements.
6. **Any entry by a junior exhibitor (18 years and under) may be made in any Lot by adding the letter "J" to the Lot Number.** First place \$3.00 Second place \$2.00
7. Exhibitors must furnish their own containers, which should be presentable. The vase or container can be used to enhance the presentation.

If using a jar, the labels must be covered or removed. Containers must be leak proof and sturdy enough to support the display. The size should fit the entry in depth and width, and be adjusted to prevent spilling or slipping of flowers. **(Example: Don't use tall, wide-mouth containers to hold 3 small stems.) No paper cups or soft plastic containers will be accepted.** The Fair Association will not assume responsibility for breakage.

ARTISTIC ARRANGEMENTS: Arrangements using artificial flowers or foliage will not be accepted. Dried materials may be sprayed or colored. LABELING: All tags and entry sheets must be filled out before submitting material. BE SURE THAT THE VARIETY IS WRITTEN ON THE EXHIBITOR'S TAG. The Fair will reserve the right to remove any exhibit at any time that its appearance is unsuited to remain on exhibit.

Conditioning Plant Material – All fresh plant material should be conditioned several hours before exhibiting or arranging. Specimens should be cut in late afternoon or early morning. A sharp knife or clippers should be used to cut stem or a long slant for the greatest intake of water. Cut specimens, should be placed in a vessel of deep tepid water in a cool, dark place for several hours or overnight. **For additional information contact Floriculture Superintendent at 720-5094.**

JUDGING: Each flower has its own criteria, but still must meet the same 4 factor headings. They will be: "Presentation" to show the uniformity and positioning of the flowers for the best presentation. "Grooming" to show no burnt, insect damaged, or dead parts. "Healthy Foliage" is to be left on to determine the health of the plant. And last is, "Flowers". If the lot calls for 3 stems-- 3 flowers should be completely open but not in there last stage. Flowers should be as uniform as possible with the same size, shape, color, and scent.

Potted Plants should have good looking soil and not be too root bound. Pots should be clean and have basins. The top of the soil should be no further down than 2" below top edge of pot, and no nursery pots larger then a 2 gal. Size.

All fruits and vegetables must be in standard pint and quart jars or 4, 6 and 8 oz. jars. Dried fruits and vegetables should be in standard pint or quart jars. Jelly must be in jars with lids, no paraffin wax and must be sealed. Classes, 23, 24, 25, 26, and, 27, will be opened by judges for testing. All entries must be labeled as to contents, method of canning, (water bath or pressure) and dates canned. Jar caps and rings should be clean, without rust. Outside of jar should be clean, not sticky. Contents, except for meats, should be covered by liquid and should not touch lid. Proper seal is important.

FRUITS: Uniformity of pack and ripeness is very important. The ripeness determines the color and texture of the fruit. The syrup or liquid should be clear, not cloudy, and should cover the contents.

VEGETABLES: Here again the liquid is very important. It must be clear and cover the vegetables.

PICKLES/RELISHES: All cucumbers and mixed pickles must be firm and crisp. Sweet pickles firm, yet tender, don't overcook. Again natural color of product used, clearness of liquid and uniformity of pack is important. Liquid should cover contents. Flavor is a vital factor in this Class. In pickling fruits, don't get them too sweet. Vegetables should not be too sour or over spiced.

JAMS? CONSERVES: Do not sieve or strain. True jams resemble crushed fruit with no separation of fruit and juice. Natural fruit flavor should be preserved. Jams should not be rubbery.

JELLIES/MARMALADES: Jelly must be transparent and have good texture (quiver) and color. It should maintain the natural fruit flavor, without crystals. Write on the entry the type of fruit used.

PRESERVES: The color and flavor must be natural to the fruit. Syrup should be clear and thick, the pieces of fruit firm and whole.

MEATS: Broth should come to 1" from top. Meat should be packed consistently. Meats must be pressure canned!

BUTTERS: Should be pureed with no chunks and about the consistency of thick honey. All canned food should be natural color, no coloring added.

DRIED FOODS: Color characteristic and shape are important. Jar should contain little amount of air and have vegetables that are brittle and fruits that are bendable and leathery.

For herbs, see Department B — Fruits, Nuts and Herbs.

1. No exhibitor shall release birds at the Fairground.
2. No exhibit is to be sold until the last day of the Fair. Anyone selling at the Fair will be held responsible to see that the buyer receives what he bought. These transactions are strictly between buyers and sellers.
3. Any violation of these rules will forfeit the exhibitor's privilege to show the **following** year.

The poultry show will be held under the rules of the American Poultry Association. The American Standard of Perfection, published by the American Poultry Association, will be used as a reference. Judging will commence at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, September 23, 2010.

Entry Fees:

Singles, twenty-five (.25) cents
Trios, seventy-five (.75) cents

Entries close Saturday before Fair opening day on Thursday. The management reserves the right to close entries sooner if show capacity is reached before that date. Entry forms may be obtained from the Department Superintendents or the Fairgrounds' General Office and must be on file before the closing date. No exceptions.
